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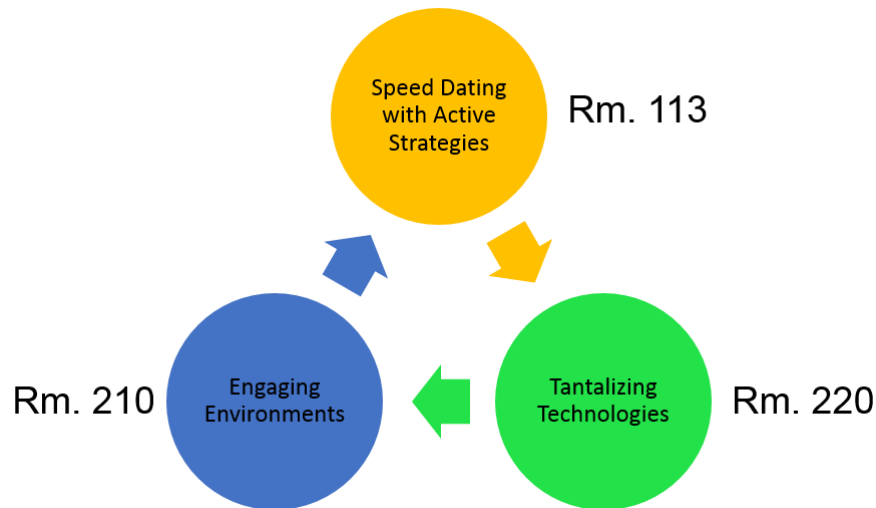

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## Rotating Session Descriptions

### *Speed Dating with Active Strategies* (501 Center, Rm. 113)

In this session, members of the Active Teaching & Learning Faculty-Interest-Group (FIG) will share a variety of strategies that you can use.
