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#### **Morning Sessions:**

**Course Design with the Learner in Mind** – In this session, you will learn how to collaborate with learners in adapting course objectives, activities, resources, and assessments to build upon learners' prior knowledge, interests, and skills as well as to integrate diverse cultural resources, practices, and perspectives into your classes. **Roadmaps for Teaching & Learning** – Recognizing that students learn and develop in diverse ways, this session will focus on how to utilize multiple evidence-based learning theories and teaching strategies to help guide course development. Facilitated by Larry Hughes

**Personalized Self-Regulated Learning** – In this session, we will explore how to partner with learners to identify personalized learning objectives to reach long term goals.
