- Excellence in Allied Health \$6,000 per year. First-time, first-year students admitted to an associate or bachelor's degree allied health program. Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.2 required.
- Wischmeier Dean's Nursing Scholarship \$6,000 per year. First-time, first-year students admitted to the BSN program. Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5.

- **HOSA Leadership Scholarship** \$1,000 one-time award for active members of high school HOSA chapter.
- Legacy Grant \$2,000 one-time award for a sibling of a current NMC student, or a sibling or dependent child of an NMC alumnus.
