Scholarship Deadlines

Academic and Leadership Scholarships: Applicants must have a completed admissions application on file and have submitted a scholarship application by December 2, 2019 to be considered for Fall 2020 Academic and Leadership Scholarships.

Upfront Merit Scholarships: Applicants must be deposited to the college and have a FAFSA on file by June 1, 2020 in order to qualify for an Upfront Merit Scholarship.

Frequently Asked Questions

What does “Rolling Deadline” mean?

A Rolling Deadline indicates that the college will review qualified applications for admission until the academic program has reached capacity. It is always in a student’s best interest to apply well in advance in order to secure a seat in the program and potentially scholarships.

Why do some programs offer multiple application deadlines?

Some of our programs offer several application deadlines so that applicants can secure their seat early in the program and begin planning for the upcoming academic year. We do not allocate a set number of seats for each deadline, however it is in the student’s best interest to complete their application early in the process. Qualified applicants are accepted at each deadline, therefore, as the start date approaches the amount of available seats decreases. High school applicants are encouraged to complete their application for review prior the December 2nd scholarship deadline.

What does “Priority Deadline” mean?

A few of our programs have placed a priority on their early deadline. This indicates the college’s goal to fill a cohort or program with applicants from the priority deadline. If seats remain, applicants can apply on a rolling basis for remaining seats or an alternate position in the program if available. Students are always encouraged to complete their application file by the priority deadline.
