

CITI Training Enrollment Procedure Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI)

What is CITI?

The Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI) is an educational program for the protection of human subjects in research. CITI focuses on ethical considerations in the protection of human subjects in research. Many institutions require CITI training when conducting research or EBP projects. This course will assist in understanding ethical considerations that researchers need to address when conducting human subject research or EBP projects. The certification is good for 2 years.

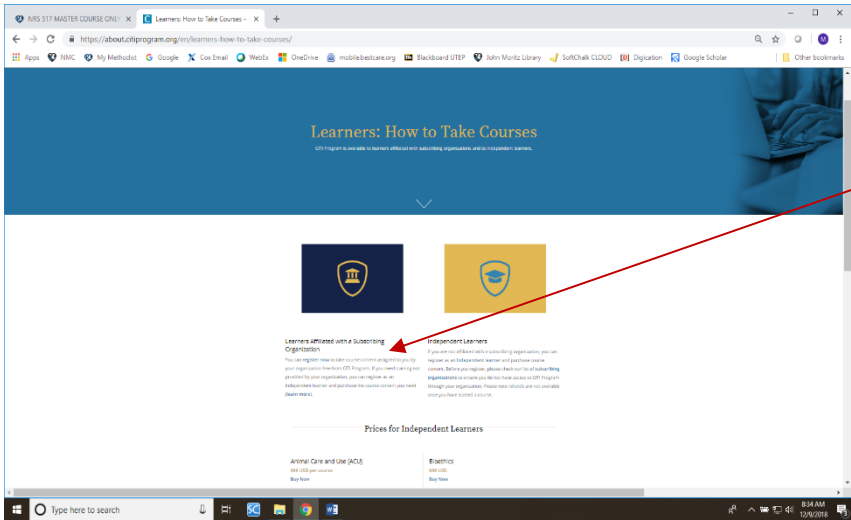
Instructions:

Complete all modules in the course on *Social Behavioral Research*.

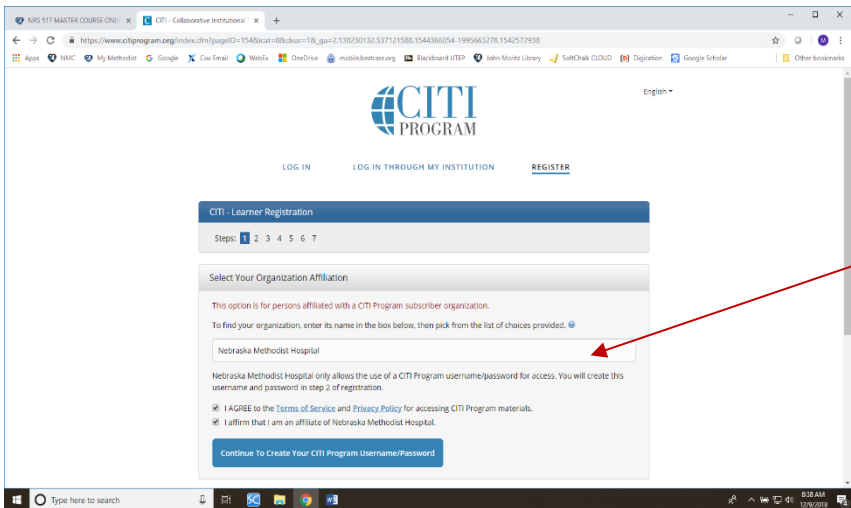
- There are about 14 short modules to complete
- Each module includes educational materials that can be read on the screen or printed out
- Each module may take 10-30 minutes to complete
- A brief quiz (3-5 questions) follows each module
- Participants are required to achieve an 80% to pass the course
 - Quizzes may be retaken until an 80% is achieved

CITI Training Enrollment Procedure:

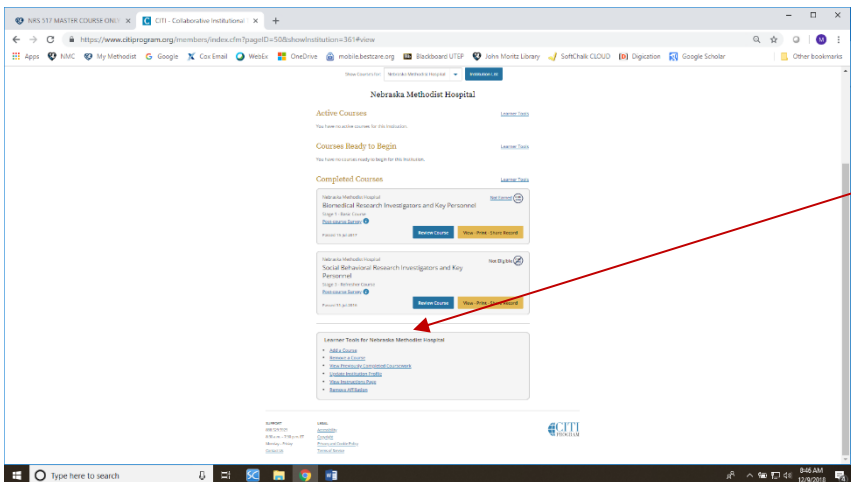
1. Students must enroll in a CITI training course:
2. Go to the CITI website at <https://about.citiprogram.org/en/learners-how-to-take-courses/>
3. Click on “register now” under *Learners Affiliated with a Subscribing Organization*.
4. Register under *Nebraska Methodist Hospital*
5. You will need to create a *user name* and *password*
6. Log in to the program and select the following course: *Social-Behavioral Researchers*
7. Once you have completed the course, CITI will send you 2 links to access your *Completion Record* and your *CITI Completion Certificate*
 - Save the PDF of the *CITI Completion Certificate* on your computer
 - Upload the CITI Completion Certificate in Assignment 2.2
