Physician Orders for: Administration of seasonal flu Immunizations  
And/or Tdap

Regarding Flu Season 2020-2021 Immunizations & education  
Pertussis Immunizations & education

Place: The underinsured/uninsured population in the Metro Area

Administered by: Methodist College Nursing Students – overseen by faculty nursing administrators

Procedure:

- 1) There may be up to a 15-minute wait time for each vaccination, and appropriate physical distancing and safety protocols will be in place
- 2) Screen participants receiving flu shots prior for risks per recommendations by CDC
- 3) Provide flu vaccine education per CDC recommendation prior to giving vaccination – Vaccine Information Sheet
- 4) Review any questions and review immunization form (Utilizing translators as needed)
- 5) Give appropriate immunization amount and recommended area by the manufacture and/or Immunization Action Coalition guidelines
- 6) Have participants remain seated and/or in area for 15 minutes following administration for monitoring
- 7) Provide the participant a copy of the vaccination form to be given to their primary care provider for their permanent record – Medical Home
- 8) Instruct participants to call 911 or go to nearest hospital emergency room if they present with severe allergic reactions when returning home
- 9) Severe Allergic Reaction on Site: If recipient of the immunization has a severe reaction to any immunization on site, give standard EpiPen dose IM (EpiPen 0.3mg per dose) – call 911 for medical assistance following EpiPen administration.

**NOTE: Children 4 years or younger are recommended to see their primary care provider for monitoring their inoculations.**
